Lakehouse was delighted to secure the project to construct a brand new state-of-the-art foundation block for nursery children at Mathilda Marks-Kennedy, a voluntary aided Jewish primary school based in Mill Hill, North London. One of the school's existing buildings was run down and decrepit and was demolished to make way for the new block, constructed with a steel frame and a pitched roof.

Lakehouse created accommodation including an office, toilet facilities, a kitchen and, most importantly for the 3-11 year olds, a wet area for arts and crafts. Members of the site team

were joined by Lakehouse's Health and Safety Manager, who conducted health and safety presentations at the school for two age groups. The presentations were delivered to keep the children informed of the improvements being made, to impart important safety advice and to raise interest and help the children to feel part of the bigger project team.

Lakehouse had an excellent relationship with the staff and children which resulted in the sponsorship of the grand opening where guest of honour, Chief Rabbi Sir Jonathan Sacks, was joined by Lakehouse's company mascot, 'Lenny Lakehouse', who wowed the children with a surprise appearance.
