In 2007 London Borough of Newham secured a £1.9million Heritage Lottery Fund grant for the restoration of Central Park, East Ham.

Some of these funds were set aside so that Lakehouse could transform the Central Park Cafe, refurbishing the existing single storey cafe and providing a single storey toilet block extension. The 22 week project also included the construction of an extension to the existing bowling pavillion which has provided a base for two skilled gardeners who look after the park.

After nearly two years' consultation between London Borough of Newham and members of Park Watch groups for Central Park, the Friends of Central Park and local residents over the

design of new facilities, local people are now enjoying the facilities which were given a well deserved boost.

Nearly half a million visitors come through the gates of Central Park every year making it Newham's most well-used and popular park. Councillor Jo Corbett, executive member for culture said
